We live in a beautiful rural area that has seen few cases of Covid 19. We have a wonderful NHS and all adults have now had the

opportunity to be vaccinated

2021 marks the 145th anniversary of Mothers' Union, brought to life by Mary Sumner's vision of women supporting families and communities. It is 100 years since she died after a truly remarkable and inspiring life. To celebrate this, Mothers' Union are asking members to count their blessings each day in

August and pop some change into a 'Blessings jar' - see www.mothersunion.org Yes, it's a fundraiser as well and a large proportion of the money raised will go to help families in the poorer countries of the world who are facing increasing problems caused by the pandemic.

The word 'hope' reminded me of a picture of a young child on the logo of 'The Anglican Children's Programme' in Zambia. Their aim is to bring vulnerable children back into the education system and away from child labour, early marriage, and often in the

education system and away from child labour, early marriage, and often in the towns and cities, a life on the streets.

In Chama, a very remote, rural district of north-eastern Zambia, the people face many problems in their daily lives. There are over 350,000 women and children who currently have little or no access to secondary education. The nearest girls' secondary school is over 100 miles away. The Anglican Children's Programme is helping to build their first secondary school for girls. Men and women from villages around the school site are helping by making bricks for the project. The girls will study the national curriculum as well as learning life skills in agriculture. The plan is for their produce to be sold and hopefully enable the school to become financially sustainable.

TORTWORTH PARISH MATTERS

The latest Parish Meeting was held on 1st June at the Tortworth Estate Office. main topics of discussion were as follows:-

Leyhill Prison – the proposal to increase the capacity of Leyhill Prison was discussed and those present raised concerns about the lack of community liaison from the Prison. This was particularly relevant if the Prison was going to expand due to concerns about issues associated with such expansion and the increased probability of absconders. This is a very real concern to people who live and work in the immediate vicinity of the Prison.

Broadband – there is frustration about poor broadband speeds in some areas, particularly when properties within close proximity to each other may have completely different broadband speeds just because they are on different sides of the county boundary. Whilst there are some initiatives to try to address this it seems that they aren't designed to be helpful to small clusters of houses.







Say goodbye to your GB Sticker

Drivers planning on road-tripping through Europe later this year will have to trade in their GB car sticker or magnet for a new 'UK' version.

The current sticker used on the back of vehicles will not be valid after September 28, the United Nations (UN) has outlined. Instead, to drive on foreign roads, motorists will have to replace it with a UK sticker Those with a GB number plate will also need a new sticker, or have to order a fresh number plate with the UK symbol.

The UN said it had received "a notification stating that the United Kingdom is changing the distinguishing sign that it had previously selected for display in international traffic on vehicles registered in the United Kingdom, from 'GB' to 'UK'". New UK stickers will be available online, and in post offices and garages for around £1.50.


