It is early morning in the middle of March and I am in my garden. The sun has just risen and in the pale morning light I watch a skylark rise up and listen to it singing over the back field. A little way off, a deer stands silently watching me watching it - how lucky am I? My dog potters happily around, investigating what has been happening overnight since he last checked his garden domain. All seems well ....

But all is far from well for people in Ukraine. They are hearing the sound of shell fire instead of birdsong, seeing smoke rise as homes burn instead of deer standing in the early morning mist. I cannot imagine how it must feel to have to quickly pack a bag, bundle up your children (and the dog) and run from your home, not knowing where you will go or if your home will still be there if you are ever able to return. Neither could the people of Ukraine six weeks ago.

The pictures in the news reports over the last couple of weeks of fathers trying to get their wives and children onto trains, the children being handed overhead by strong arms towards the soldiers waiting by the open train doors, remain fresh in my mind. The devastated face of a young boy squashed against a train window as he tearfully waves goodbye to his father, who clutches a precious toy car as he turns to go and prepare to defend his village haunt my thoughts.

I look out of my window. The sky has clouded over and the skylark has moved on, but I can still see the deer, peacefully grazing but always alert to danger ....

### **TORTWORTH PARISH MATTERS**

The latest Parish Meeting was held on 1<sup>st</sup> March at the Tortworth Estate Office. The main topics of discussion were as follows:-

Leyhill Prison – HMP Leyhill Governor, Steve Hodson, attended the meeting to provide an update on what is happening at the prison. A virtual meeting was held with local representatives to discuss any concerns about the plans for additional capacity at the Prison. Subsequently, a WhatsApp group has been established to disseminate information about any absconds that occur from the prison. This is being administered by the Tortworth Parish Clerk and members of the local community can ask to join it by emailing the address below. Consent has now been granted for the development.

Local Planning Matters – Cllr John O'Neill provided an update on developments at Falfield, Charfield and the proposed Charfield Railway Station. There was also a discussion about community monies which will arise from some of these developments and how some funding has been earmarked for developing the Moreton Ground which is occupied by Charfield Junior Football Club. Concerns were raised about the Ground not becoming over-developed.

**AGM** – The Annual General Meeting followed. Neil Hampson continues as Chairman for the ensuing year. The decision was made to donate £50 towards the running costs of community newsletter 'FiveAlive'

The next meeting is on **Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2022** at The Tortworth Estate Office at 7.30pm. All parishioners are welcome to the meeting.



### **FALFIELD PARISH COUNCIL REPORT**

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March with all Councillors in attendance along with Ward Cllr John O'Neill and two parishioners. In his report to the Council Ward Councillor O'Neill confirmed that no news had been received from either Linden Homes or South Gloucestershire Council concerning the future of the Park & Share in Moorslade Lane.

Although unable to be present the Frampton & Charfield Beat Team reported that there had been an increase recently in thefts of vehicle number plates which may be due to the recent increase in the cost of fuel and that parishioners might consider purchasing a number plate security kit for added security. Also, parishioners should be aware that there has been a recent spate of burglaries in adjacent villages targeting homes while the homeowner is away. The offenders are after cash and jewellery and are using a vehicle. They advise the use of timer switches on lamps if you are out in the evening to make your home look occupied. The next Beat Team Surgery in the Village will be on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April in the Village Hall from 2pm to 3pm.

Councillors agreed their response to the South Gloucestershire Local Plan – Phase 2 consultation which would be submitted before the deadline of 4<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

A number of highways issues were discussed which included the condition of the pavement outside Orchard View, which would be raised with StreetCare, and the latest on the issues previously raised with StreetCare and National Highways, but still outstanding, concerning the amount of debris on the A38 in the area of Mount Pleasant and the removal of litter on the B4509 and the slip roads on junction 14 of the M5.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April** in the Village Hall commencing at 7.30 pm.

### **ROCKHAMPTON PARISH COUNCIL**

The Parish Council met on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> February 2022 which was attended by three members of the public.

Councillors decided to respond to the South Gloucestershire Local Plan – Phase 2, in particular the section regarding proposals for Wind Energy which could have an impact on the Parish. Councillors also discussed the planning application for a temporary worker's dwelling on land off Hill Road and agreed, taking into account comments raised earlier during public participation, to object to this application on the grounds of potential flooding, the development was considered to be out of character with its surrounding and that the design of the proposed dwelling did not resemble a temporary dwelling.

Cllrs also discussed the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and how the Parish Council should commemorate this. It was suggested that a commemorative bench would be appropriate although funding would need to be found and it was agreed to establish what grants might be available before taking this forward. Although not present, it was understood that Cllr Mitchell-Skinner was organising an informal committee to discuss the planned Picnic on the Green on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2022 and that more information would follow at a later date.

The next Parish Council meeting will be the Annual Parish Council meeting on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2022 in the Village Hall which will be preceded by the Annual Parish meeting which will commence at 7pm.



That's a first! Gill Spiller, our president announced there were no members with a birthday in March for us to sing to, so we sang 'Happy New Home' instead as two of our ladies were moving away. Our speaker was John Riddiford, a volunteer firefighter in Thornbury whose family have run the grocery shop at the top of the High Street for many years.

He told us that when he was a young lad, he would hear the siren sound on the top of the old police station (now the town hall) then either run or get on his bike and charge up Castle Street from his home to watch the men and engines go off from the fire station in the High Street where it used to be situated. He's now been with the fire service for thirty-one years. Thornbury has twenty-six firefighters, two fire engines as well as an Ambulance Response Car. A lot more callouts now are for accidents rather than fires; the area they cover extends beyond Thornbury to include the motorway and over to Chepstow.

Once again, the weather was not great for our walk on the footpath around Newark Park where a lot of tree work and clearing up is being done, but the footpaths were fine; we were grateful for a much-needed hot drink in the National Trust marquee.

We'll be hosting the coffee morning on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> April, from 10am – 12 noon along with a book stall.

#### CROMHALL ROAD SAFETY PROJECT

Last November saw the first meeting of the Cromhall Road Safety Project (CRiSP). Formed in response to a post on Nextdoor.co.uk from a local resident concerned about speeding vehicles through Cromhall, we've come together to try to provide a safe environment for all members of our community and our visitors.

We had a huge turnout from local residents, which demonstrates that this issue is affecting so many people. Residents complained of the speeding HGVs and cars, the lack of enforcement of speed limits, lack of effective signage and the safety issues around the lack of paths around the village in some places.

We've had monthly meetings since and have started progress on tackling these issues. Including:

- Building links with local companies where their speeding vehicles have been identified
- Setting up a Community Speedwatch group (to get involved, please contact Hannah on cromhall.speedawareness@gmail.com)
- Collating data on speeding.

There's still much more we'd like to do, including building stronger links with our local police officers, engaging with local community and sports groups and identifying other ways to tackle these issues.
