TYTHERINGTON & ITCHINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

The new Tytherington & Itchington Parish Council met for the first time on Monday 5th June, and although quorate, do need 3 more councillors to join the Council. Cllrs Lipton, Daly and Johnson have stayed on the Council for a further term of 4 years and have been joined by Cllr Gordon, a new resident of Tytherington & Itchington Parish. There will be an item on the agenda on the next Parish Council meeting to be held on the 10th July to co-opt anyone from the Parish who would like to join the above Councillors in making Tytherington & Itchington a great place to live. So, if you feel like joining, please come along to the next meeting and volunteer your time and efforts for the next 4 years. If you have any questions, please contact the Clerk at clerk@tytherington-pc.gov.uk. For your information Cllr Lipton is the new Chair of the Council and Cllr Daly the Vice Chair.

The hedgehog drawing competition was a great success and congratulations to the winners who were announced at the May Day fair. It was great to see the May Day fair back on the calendar and congratulations to all those who helped make it such a resounding success. A swallow tower has now been installed on one of the eaves of the Village Hall and we look forward to having the swallows nest in the boxes provided over the next few years.

Following on from the circulation of the VAS data and also the data compiled from the cables across Stowell Hill Road to the Police and South Glos Officers, the Parish Council have asked our Ward Councillors to support the next step which is to ask them to support a transport scheme which they are happy to do. The Parish Council now needs to consider what form of traffic calming they would like to request. All submissions are assessed by officers who then select the highest scoring schemes for further investigation in the next financial year. It's essential that the Parish Council and parishioners narrow down the various options to something that would be broadly supported within the village. Discussions will be taking place with our Ward Councillors as soon as possible. From reading the speed data it seems the highest speeds are coming into the village down Stowell Hill Road and up Duck Street with 99% of the traffic in the middle stretch of the village being below the enforceable threshold. Therefore, it seems sensible for the Parish Council to focus upon what measures they would like to see at either end of the village. If anyone has any suggestions they would like to put forward for discussion please again let the Clerk know at clerk@tytherington-pc.gov.uk.

The Parish Council have been in contact with Cotswold Homes and Henrietta Armstrong, the architect who has produced a sculpture to be sited in the vicinity of Walnut Fields. Both parties have assured the Parish Council that all residents will be invited to both occasions.



Westlink Bus Service

On-demand, tailor made trips in the West of England area

WESTlink is a new type of bus service which operates in the vast majority of the West of Eng-

land, outside of Bristol and Bath city centres. It runs without a fixed timetable or route and is booked 'on demand' by users through the **WESTlink** app or by phone.

Passengers can get on or off at existing bus stops (over 1,800) as well as at a number of easy to reach places, and then connect to major bus and rail services.

There are approximately 30 buses running across the region, which can take up to 16 passengers each. These will operate within 3 zones, North, South and the Future Transport Zone

pilot (journeys are

limited to within each zone, except for shared areas).

The North Zone, of which the 5 villages are a part, covers roughly the following areas:

(Please note this list is for reference only. Always refer to the map, apps or customer advisors to confirm your journey will be within the zone.)



Bathavon North (partially, eastern areas excluded), Keynsham East (fully), Keynsham North (partially, western areas excluded), Keynsham South (fully)

South Gloucestershire wards:

Bitton & Oldland Common (the majority, with some excep-

tions), Boyd Vale (fully), Charfield (fully), Chipping Sodbury & Cotswold Edge (fully), Dodington (fully), Frampton Cotterell (fully), Longwell Green (partially, southern area only), Parkwall & Warmley (partially, northern area only), Pilning & Severn Beach (partially, northern area boundary with Severn Vale only), Severn Vale (fully), Thornbury (fully), Winterbourne (partially, south-western corner excluded), Yate Central (fully), Yate North (fully)

Fares & pricing

- Only single fares are currently available at £2 for adults and £1 for children. Young children that are able to sit on an paying adult's lap travel for free.
- All concessionary and older person's bus passes will be accepted from 9am Monday to Friday and all day Saturday, Sunday and Public holidays.
- Booking is available via a mobile app, website or on the phone. Journeys can be booked on-demand or on the day before travel from 07:00.
- You can book multiple journeys, which means you can book your return journey just after booking your first journey.

Banana Jam

Banana jam is easy to make and quite delicious. It also makes for a great banana topping for waffles or ice cream.

Ingredients:

- Bananas
- 1 pint apple juice to each pound of sliced bananas
- ½ lb preserving sugar
- Lemon juice

Method:

- Peel the bananas, slice, and weigh them.
- Put the apple juice and sugar, in the above-mentioned proportions, into a preserving pan, add the juice of one lemon and bring to the boil.
- Stir until the sugar has dissolved, then add the bananas.
- Stir until it boils, then cook gently until the mixture becomes thick.
- Skim frequently and bottle.
- Cover whilst hot.

Autumn Years Director Victoria Irish said, "Our respite centres are a haven for anyone living with dementia or living in isolation. They are a place where someone can enjoy a stimulating and fun-filled time while their loved ones take a much-needed break."

The Respite Centres run every week throughout the year and activities are designed around each individual's interests and capabilities to ensure that they make the most of every minute.

Victoria continued, "We are very aware of the impact that loneliness can have on a person's health, so our focus will always be on helping our clients to

improve their physical and mental wellbeing, reduce their anxiety and stress levels and maintain their independence and quality of life."
