Others are disappearing for most, making a wish when we stir the Christmas pudding, door to door carol singing, going to Church(!)..... No more driving round the village with a tractor and trailer, harmonium perched on the back and handbells sounding out in various farm kitchens.



Families develop their own traditions and maybe it's no bad thing that they change. Until a couple of years ago I'd probably never driven a car on Christmas afternoon. Now family commitments mean that we drive across the country on Christmas Day to meet up with our family. We have a great time singing carols very loudly in the car on Christmas afternoon! There seem to be far more activities like carol singing and Nativities going on around urban areas rather than the country. Christmas celebrations certainly extend much further than just Christian countries. A nephew in Borneo says that all the shop assistants in his local town are wearing festive hats and Deeley boppers at this time of year!

Two thousand years ago, in an occupied country in the Middle East where there had been constant violence and fighting for hundreds of years, a baby was born in a rough old shed . It seems some things really don't change; humans find it hard to live peaceably with each other. There are an awful lot of people in the Middle East and throughout the world who won't get a chance to celebrate any religious festivals this year. Let's hope everyone can realistically seek some sort of compromise and peace as we approach another New Year.

Maybe we should look forward and start our own new traditions. They might just be modifications of an old one, or maybe totally new. After all, that footpath around the edge of our local stream is far more interesting than the old straight line across the field!

Have a great Christmas and New Year whatever traditions you follow!

St George's Church will be preparing for Christmas in a different way this year.

During our December services the Church is alight with the warm glow of lit candles placed in the windows of the church. We hope this is a welcoming sign for you to come and join us for any of our services this month. We offer a quiet time to sit and reflect as well as sing in this busy run up to Christmas Day.

There are two traditional services mark the approach to Christmas: 'Carols by Candlelight' and the 'Christingle' service. This year we will be combining our celebration on Christmas Eve starting at 3.30pm

Christingle is a delight as families come together to hear again the Christmas story, during which children gradually build up the Crib scene which is placed at the front of the church and hear the

Cardiac Risk in the Young is £1,325.00p.



#### Latest news on the Armstrong Hall

At last, the Armstrong Hall Charitable Trust, managed by the Town Council, has drawn up a plan to prepare cases for three options in Thornbury. This is thanks to the efforts of James Murray and several of the new Councillors.

Cllr Danny Bonnett is organising the plan, and they have engaged several of us to help with the work needed.



The project is being called CARPIT, and a flowchart is shown of the processes, in brief, along with the fundraising reports the Trust has already received – see left.

Options A (Armstrong) and C (Cossham) may well merge, providing further sub-options down the line for exactly what to do at what point. There is also Option T for the plan to build new facilities at Turnberries instead.

On 7<sup>th</sup> December they will once again look for engagement from the community to see how the process is going, and to invite further comment, which could be invaluable for shaping possibilities. (See page 9)

I really hope you and people you know will be interested and able to attend on 7<sup>th</sup> or will send in your thoughts and ideas if you can't make that date.

We are extremely aware that the term "community" extends well beyond the boundaries of Thornbury, and we most warmly welcome everyone's interest.
